Movie: The Great Yellowstone Thaw Part 1 Yellowstone is home to North America's most iconic wildlife, and every year these animals must survive the Thaw - one of the harshest seasonal changes on Earth. Temperatures can swing from minus 40°F in winter to almost 100°F in summer. To understand how the animals cope, this series follows the Thaw during 2016 - a year when the unpredictable weather broke new records. 50 min.

Join a Tamarac Ranger for a night of catching croakers. We'll start with identification of frogs by sight and sound while learning about their natural history and significance to the ecosystem. Meet at the Discovery Center to start and then we'll drive to a marsh.
